Advanced Trial Advacacy Course Child Homicide Baylor Law School in Waco July 28-August 1, 2025 22.5 hours of MCLE credit, including 1 hour of ethics

Advanced Trial Advocacy Course Information

DCAA's Advanced Trial Advocacy Course is designed for prosecutors with at least three to five years of trial experience who want to prepare and participate in a hands-on course to increase their effectiveness in trial. Upon acceptance, all participants will receive a detailed packet of instructions and a felony case scenario that will form the basis of the presentations, faculty demonstrations, workshops, and courtroom performances. Each participant is responsible for the entire case scenario, although individual performances may involve only a particular aspect of the case. Upon arrival, participants will be assigned to one of the law school's practice courtrooms with a smaller group of eight participants and experienced faculty advisors who will guide the group discussions and provide critiques of each participant's live and recorded performances. This year, participants will focus on a child homicide case to learn how to address many of the challenges stemming from these types of cases.

Attendance: Attendance is limited to 32 prosecutors. Application review will begin on **June 27**. Interested prosecutors should submit their applications prior to that date to ensure they are considered. No walk-in registrations will be accepted under any circumstances. Upon acceptance, participants will receive confirmation, informational packets, and detailed felony case scenarios via email. Advance preparation and full-week participation are required. Applicants who are not accepted for this course will be put on a waiting list and have first priority in case of cancellations. **Any attendee substitutions must be submitted to and approved by TDCAA.**

Registration and fees: There is no fee for attending this course. TDCAA will pay for the hotel and reimburse your travel at the current GSA rate. Participants will receive a per diem reimbursement, also at the current GSA rate, for meals, which are on your own. All participants will stay at the AC Hotel by Marriott Waco Downtown, 600 Mary Ave., in Waco, TX 76701. Classes are a short drive to the Baylor University Law School, which is located at 1114 South University Parks Drive, Waco, TX 76706. **Upon acceptance, TDCAA will make hotel reservations for all participants. Do not call the hotel directly.** Rooms are reserved beginning Sunday, July 27, with departure on Friday, August 1. If you do NOT need the hotel room on Sunday night and plan to check in Monday instead, please let meeting planner Andie Peters know by replying to your initial acceptance email from us. All incidental expenses, including room upgrades, double occupancy, room service, movie rentals, etc., are your own.

Attire: On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, courtroom attire is required. On Friday, business casual dress is acceptable.
