Serving Texas' Children The CAC Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) approach provides six core services:

Shared Goals for ALL CACs Need for increased collaboration amongst partners Achieving an effective coordinated response to child abuse Clear understanding of agency protocols, mandates, and policies Facilitate successful outcomes in both the child protection and criminal justice systems through effective, collaborative fact finding and coordinated case development Minimize revictimization of child victims and protective family members throughout the investigation and prosecution processes


Provides direction for MOUs and Working Protocols


- Defines membership & scope of MDTs

Section 264.4061


- Mandates when an MDT response must occur
 Establishes requirement & procedures for the forensic interview


