We know that you did not ask to be a crime victim, and are committed to helping you with compassion and care during what may be a very difficult time. Please keep in mind that the HCDAO represents the State of Texas in court proceedings, as a violation of Texas law has occurred. The HCDAO does not represent you personally, nor any legal guardian or close relative associated with the case.

The defendant or someone on the defendant's behalf may try to contact you. You do not have to speak with anyone representing the defendant. If the defendant or someone representing the defendant threatens you or tries to intimidate you, please contact law enforcement and the prosecutor assigned to your case.

This form will assist the prosecutor, judge, and correctional agencies with the prosecution of your case.
